Welcome to the UDesign Justice Initiative's "Housing Justice Action Dialogue Workshop". This session convenes a focused Housing Day to surface lived experiences, policy gaps, and community-led solutions to homelessness and housing precarity among racialized and marginalized communities in Calgary.

Prompt

"Please introduce yourself:

What brought you into this work, and why did you choose this path in housing justice?

Share one experience that shaped your commitment – whether from community, policy, and design practice."

Guiding Themes for Discussion:

Each table discusses these themes: Community, Policy, or Design.

Theme	Focus	Intended Connection to Workshop
Community	Frontline engagement, advocacy, and grassroots responses to housing inequities.	Identify community-level barriers or bright spots to shape <i>opportunity</i> statements.
Policy	Systemic and institutional barriers, legislation, and municipal frameworks.	Pinpoint policy gaps or misalignments to inform <i>pilot opportunities</i> .
Design	Built form, systems design, cultural safety, and inclusive planning practices.	Inspire <i>pilot prototypes</i> or co-design initiatives.

Sprint # 1: Problems → Opportunities

Time: 30 minutes

Purpose:

Participants identify the most pressing challenges and promising practices from the panel discussion, organized by the three themes.

Facilitator Instructions:

- 1. Each table focuses on these themes: *Community*, *Policy*, or *Design*.
- 2. Ask participants to map barriers, gaps, and "bright spots."
- 3. Encourage discussion on what they heard during the panel connecting insights to their own experiences.
- 4. Guide the group to write 1–2 opportunity statements on sticky notes or in their quidebook.

Prompt:

"From what you heard during the panel, what barriers stood out? Where did you hear a bright spot or spark of potential that could be expanded?"

Activities:

1.1. Mapping

- Barriers
- Gaps
- Bright Spots (A small success, a promising practice, or a moment of effectiveness that can be learned from, scaled, or replicated.)

1.2. Opportunity Statement

This workshop is an opportunity for collaborators to identify concrete, equity-focused changes they can implement within their own organizations to better address housing precarity and support housing justice.

Output:

1-2 concise Opportunity Statements per table

(e.g., "Limited culturally safe transitional housing for newcomer women could become an opportunity to co-design community-led shelter models.")

Sprint # 2: Ideas → Pilots

Time: 30 minutes

Purpose:

Turn the most promising opportunity into a concrete pilot concept – identifying who, how, and when it could be implemented.

Facilitator Instructions:

- 1. Each table selects one opportunity from Sprint 1.
- 2. Work collaboratively to fill in a Pilot One-Pager Template.
- Keep discussions practical and time-bound (Now / Soon / Later).
- 4. Encourage participants to identify who should own, fund, or lead the pilot.
- 5. Close by sharing one pilot idea per table.

Prompt:

"Choose one opportunity and shape it into a pilot idea. Who should lead it? Who benefits? What resources or partnerships are needed to make it real?"

Activity:

Pick one pilot project, and consolidate the ideas onto the large sheet at your table.

Field	Description	
Goal	What is the project trying to achieve?	
Beneficiaries	Who directly benefits?	
Partners/ Owner	Who leads or collaborates?	
Timeline	Now (0-6 mo) Soon (6-12 mo) Later (1-3 yrs)	
Resources Needed	Funding, expertise, space, data, etc.	
Risks/ Challenges	What barriers could arise?	
Success Indicators	What does success look like?	
Equity Check	Who might be excluded, and how can we include them?	

Closing Reflections (Optional Plenary)

Purpose:

Share back key opportunities and pilot ideas, highlighting cross-sector collaboration and next steps for UDJI.

Prompt:

"Thank you for contributing your insights and imagination. These ideas will inform the UDesign Justice Initiative's ongoing collaborations with our partners — helping move from dialogue to design, and from ideas to action."
