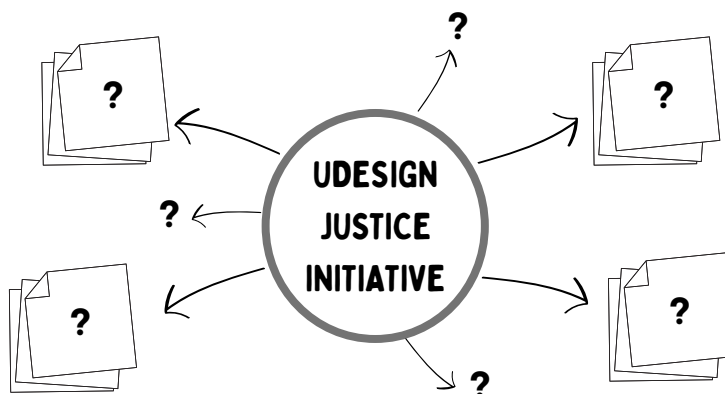

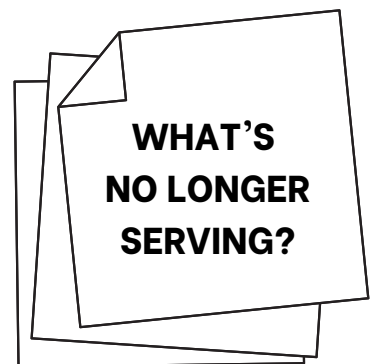
### 3. Identify **NEXT STEPS**
